Stars in the Making!

The HSC Drama exams proved to be no drama at all, as absolutely spectacular performances were given by all of this year's Drama cohort. The HSC Drama performance exams were held on Tuesday, 3rd September in the school hall. As a part of the HSC Drama course all students must undertake a Group Performance and an Individual Project. For the Individual option, 2 students chose design, creating costumes, posters and other promotional material. One student chose critical analysis: Director's Folio and 7 chose the ever popular performance option. As an integral part of live theatre, 20 students from Year 10 and Year 11 formed the technical stage crew and audience for the exam day.

The day began with the dynamic and engaging Group Performances that were so well received by the audience and markers alike that even a scream was uttered by a marker during a particularly impressive acrobatic movement that saw a performer shooting across the stage from a previously concealed location. The individual performances spanned a range of styles from realism and musical theatre to slapstick that featured a pair of unforgettable 'duckie' boxers.

The students will now focus on the written component of the Drama course that will be completed during the regular HSC exam period. Overall a very talented bunch of performers who have bright futures in the performing arts industry.

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Premier's Debating Challenge Round 3

The Year 7 and Year 8 Maclean High School debating teams recently hosted two debates against Grafton High School in the third round of the 2019 Premier's Debating Challenge.

Viruses that cause measles, chickenpox and shingles could make this child extremely unwell. If we know that there has been exposure to measles, chickenpox or shingles, medicine can be given to lessen the side effect of such an infection to this child. This medicine does need to be given as soon as possible after the contact has taken place.

Maclean High School 2019 Learning Support Graduates

Each year the Maclean High School Learning Support Faculty are proud to watch students from the various support classes graduate and 2019 is no exception. There are nine Year 12 students graduating in 2019. Each of the students has reached milestones and accomplished academic and social goals along the way. The classes provide intensive support, individual adjustments and a wide range of experiences throughout the junior and senior curriculum. Planning begins before the student enrols and there is close collaboration with parents and carers for the whole journey. Consultation with School Counsellors and relevant outside agencies is also a priority.

Students experience a variety of adjustments, programs and inclusion with class activities, extra curricula ventures, work experience and cultural events. This is personalised learning at its best!

As they reach senior school, taking into account the individual's needs and wants, families are encouraged to undertake the processes involved in transition from school to work (SLES) which allows the individual a more meaningful and supported passage into the world away from school.

Brady's Amazing Achievements

When Brady first arrived at Maclean High School, he was extremely anxious around the large school population, wary of staff and believed he could not read or write. He found many situations in the school routine highly stressful and was easily agitated.



Even at that young age, Brady felt he

would not fit into social situations or workplaces when he left school and this was constantly upsetting. The goals set in junior school were to provide experiences and to build academic and social skills, giving him a sense of belonging and accomplishment. There have been many highs and lows over this journey, but perseverance and cooperation have paid off. Brady has developed many positive social skills and has found areas of interest in classes where he has used strategies to cope with everyday life. Great team work with the teaching staff, Learning Support Officers, School Counsellors, administration staff and family have ensured Brady has progressed through senior schooling, eventually to graduate at the end of this term with his cohort. He has become much more independent rather than relying on his support staff, teachers and family for classwork and decision making.

Along the way we have nurtured his interests in video games, movies and computer skills and found that Brady could write fantasy fiction. His creative writing assessment has culminated into a twenty thousand word story based on the 'Sky Lander' and 'Splatoon' themes. He is currently working on a number of other projects. Brady has also produced a YouTube video.

He has taken opportunities such as work experience in school as well as at Clarence Valley Wholesalers in Grafton and is currently at SPAR Maclean. Brady is preparing for a smooth transition out of school with a plan that has involved Malean High School, his parents and outside agencies. He has had the benefits of support which have enabled him to function as a proud, young adult with options in the future. You never know, we may even see him publish some of his writing. Maclean High School is extremely proud of his achievements.

Lilli

Lilli arrived in Maclean in Year 8, returning to the hometown of her mother and very wary of the unfamiliar environment at Maclean High School. Initially she was fearful and extremely self conscious. Lilli has since grown in confidence and the belief that she is a strong, motivated and proud Yaegl woman. As a valued member of the Support classes, Lilli has worked consistently with her teacher, Learning Support Officers and her family to overcome many anxieties and has found that she is able to grasp more academic concepts than she imagined.

She is a very social person who has thrown herself into many of the opportunities provided at Maclean High School. She has enjoyed dance groups, Student Representative Council activities and the 2019 School Musical. She is particularly proud of her Indigenous culture where she has been a active participant in the Junior and Senior AIME Programs, The Maclean High School River of Learning and the Yarning Circles. Lilli has been able to speak at assemblies and loves to lead 'Welcome to Country'. Lilli was elected as one of the 2019 Vice Captains and she has represented the school to the best of her abilities. She has displayed empathy and a newfound independence in her work experience roles in the school canteen and has thoroughly enjoyed her weekly encounters at the Yamba Community Preschool. Lilli and her family have been planning for a smooth transition from school into the community and she is very excited to be graduating from Year 12. We look forward to seeing continued growth and hearing about her future endeavours.

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Tell Them From Me student feedback survey (Term 4, 2019)

I am delighted that next term our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the *Tell Them From Me* student feedback survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing engagement and effective teaching practices.

You may remember that our students also participated in a *Tell Them From Me* student survey in Term 1 this year. Asking students to complete the survey twice in one year allows us to identify trends in student responses as well as track engagement and motivation across the school year.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. More than 6,300 schools in Australia and around the world have used *Tell Them from Me* to survey 5.4 million students. Capturing the voices of our students will help improve how we do things at our school.

I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours in Weeks 1 and 2 of Term 4. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.
