NSW School Vaccination Program 2021

As per the Australian Technical Advisory Group on Immunisation (ATAGI):

"Co-administration of a COVID-19 vaccine with other vaccines is not routinely recommended. A minimum 7-day interval is advised between administration of a COVID-19 vaccine and any other vaccine"



Please ensure that if your child is having a COVID 19 vaccine, that it is at least 7 days either side of the scheduled school vaccine for which you consented in 2021.

Please ensure your child is aware of the date they received a COVID 19 vaccine. We are able to review the Australian Immunisation Register to confirm, however this is very time consuming for the nursing team.

If your child misses a consented school vaccine, we will offer a catch up in Term 1 2022.




The Agriculture Farm

School Travel for 2022

Students who need a travel pass for 2022 can apply now. A new application will need to be submitted if they are applying for a school travel pass for the first time, or if they are requesting an additional travel entitlement as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (eg joint custody).

Students who change address, school, campus location, or who have repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should renew or update their details before the end of Term 4. This will ensure that schools can endorse applications and current entitlements are updated and remain valid.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the start of the new school year from their nominated transport operator. Students/parents should confirm with their nominated operator if they do not receive a pass.

On 1st October 2021 the School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) information and application portal was moved to Transportnsw.info. This will assist families to find all their travel information in the one

place. We ask that parents plan ahead and make sure their child knows which service to use and has a valid ticket to travel from the start of the school year.

Applications for the School Student Transport Scheme (SSTS) open at the start of Term 4, 2021 for travel in 2022, so parents/carers can apply or update details early and be ready for the start of the new school year.

All positions will be open and some of these positions are: Club President,


Junior President, Secretary, Treasurer, Registrar, Coaching Co-ordinator, Communication and PR Officer, Canteen Co-ordinator.
