The boys team of Nathan Hayman, Matthew Taylor, Ethan Fisher and Boston Heffernan were faced with a far more daunting prospect against a full strength Alstonville High School team on their home courts in the Stan Jones Trophy.

The highly seeded matches produced top level, quality tennis, with Nathan going down narrowly to his Alstonville opponent 6-4 and Matt winning 6-1 in a scintillating performance. Our newcomers Ethan and Boston fought throughout their matches with some good rallies and close games but unfortunately not enough for wins. This built the pressure for the doubles matches but eventually the depth and quality of our opponents was too much to withstand with the boys losing 5 sets to 3 overall.




Youth In Design Workshops

Far North Coast Combined Schools Surfing Titles

Monday saw a formidable Maclean High School surfing team head to Lennox Head to compete in the Far North Coast Combined School Surfing Titles. Our team consisted of Lilli Young and Max Hutchinson in the Under 19 division and Millie Speirs, Yayden Campbell, Solomon Read, Harley Walters and Will Woldseth competing in the Under 16 division.

We were greeted by an early cross offshore wind and 2 to 3 foot of tricky but contestable shifting peaks, de-rigueur for Lennox Head beachies. These conditions make it a difficult prospect for the inexperienced surfer from a different location and plays into the hands of the local surfers who deal with these conditions on a day to day basis. That being said our surfers, some with experience and some without, took to the conditions with a desire to put in their best performance.

As expected, experience was a telling factor in the rhythm of our surfers' heats; our experienced competitors absolutely nailed their heats while our less experienced and free surfing superstars like Will and Sol could not find the sort of wave in the deteriorating conditions and dropping tide to put together two high scoring waves. Millie must be congratulated for her first effort back in the competitive arena. With the tide dropping and wind howling, she took to the water and after an arduous paddlethon just to get into the line-up, made it to the outside to get the biggest wave of the heat but could not capitalise with a second scoring wave and fell out of the draw.

The rest of our team, the more experienced competitive surfers all surfed explosively and blew up with high scoring waves in all their heats. Yayden narrowly falling out of the draw in his quarter final after methodically taking the waves apart and Max after a scintillating carve and completion on his highest scoring wave just could not find the right wave in his semi-final to push him into the final four.

What can I say about our two final surfers, both definately professional surfing aspirants, both with the ability to go all the way to that end. Lilli never missed a beat and her fitness, competitive spirit and ability










to string together multiple turns on a wave easily accounted for her opponents to win the Under 19 girls division.

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Careers News HSC Subject Selection - Picking the right subjects for you and your future

In the lead up to HSC subject selection we will be running a few little sections in the newsletter to give you confidence in assisting your Year 10 students to transition into Year 11 and Year 12 with confidence. Later this term we will be running our subject selection evening for Year 10 students; this will complement the lessons we have been undertaking in Year 10 Careers this term. Here are a few tips when trying to help your Maclean High School Year 10 family member pick subjects:

Does the subject interest me?

You have to turn up every lesson so make sure you pick subjects you like, not subjects your friends like or because your favourite teacher is taking it.

What sort of assessments would I be doing?

Do you like essays? Would you be happy doing only tests? Is there a public speaking component? Do you have to do Work Placement? Assessments can determine how well you go in a subject. Talk to the teacher currently teaching it to find out more.

Will the subject help me when I transition from school?

Will this subject help land me an apprenticeship? Do I have to do this subject to get into the degree I want to do? Can this subject provide an insight into a potential career I would like to pursue? Use your subjects to get you to where you want to go.

If I want to go to uni will the subject count?

Not all subjects will count toward an ATAR and some have caveats. Make sure you know which subjects are which.

REMEMBER whichever subjects you choose, they will not determine your whole future. You might choose certain subjects in Year 10 to focus on in Year 11, but that won't necessarily determine what you do in Year 12. We do have trial periods and cut-off dates by which you can change subjects, so talk to your teachers, Year Adviser and Miss Fisher, our Careers Adviser, to find out what works best for you.
