### **Policy Changes**

If your child has been placed on a suspension, you will be invited to the school to attend a school planning meeting. This meeting has replaced the return or resolution of suspension meeting.

### What is a return to school planning meeting?

Your child will come back to school on or before the date the suspension ends. Your positive engagement with the school is very important in managing your child's behaviour and developing solutions together. Before your child returns we will contact you by phone to arrange a planning meeting with school staff who work closely with your child.

The meeting will be about how you can work together to support your child when they return to school. You can bring a support person with you to the meeting. A support person may be someone who can provide you and/or your child with practical and/or emotional support.

For behaviours of concern which need more strategies and supports, we will work with you and your child to develop a behaviour support plan to support them and reduce any risks. This plan will be shared with you and with other staff in the school who support your child.

An important part of this process for us at Maclean High School is the student voice. We want students to identify any obstacles or barriers they face and support them to come up with solutions and strategies that will best support their learning.

Parents and carers are welcome to request meetings outside of a school planning meeting. The following are some suggestions as to who might be appropriate, particularly if it is for an initial meeting.

The Maclean Open Boys Cricket side have made a solid start to their Alan Davidson Shield campaign.

After a bye in round 1, we travelled to Kyogle in round 2 where the boys put on a dominant display with the bat, making a massive 275 off their 30 overs. Luke Lambert (103 n.o.) and Zachary Quick (81) did most of the damage.
