Thomas Gallagher our Grafton Shoppingworld Junior Sportsperson of the month for September!

Tyndale's Thomas Gallagher finished the 2022 Australian Kart Championship in the Class Tag 125 Seniors division third overall, including 1st in the NSW round at Newcastle and 2nd at Melbourne. Other highlights included 2nd at Queensland State Titles and 4th at Victoria State Titles.

Karting since he was seven, the 18-year-old has enjoyed his best season behind the wheel, after no official national championships the past two years due to the pandemic.

Finding venues to practice and compete has been a challenge since the Grafton Sporting Car Club ceased karting at Mountain View Motor Sport Complex, with the family often travelling to Coffs Harbour, Ipswich and Newcastle.

Once competitors turn 16 they are required to compete at Seniors level, making his achievements more incredible as some of his rivals were adults.

The Maclean High Year 12 student is about to sit for his HSC exams, and has been accepted into the Royal Australian Air Force in 2023.

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Policy Changes

The NSW Department of Education has moved to a new suspension and discipline policy which is now called the 'Student Behaviour Policy'. Each week in the Newsletter we will provide some information outlining a key change or update.

Formal Caution

Under the new Student Behaviour Policy, a Warning of Suspension has been replaced by a Formal Caution to Suspend. A formal caution may be issued when a student is exhibiting a behaviour of concern. A formal caution tells a student that their behaviour caused or may cause harm or danger to themselves and other people. It is designed to let you and your child know that their behaviour needs to improve.

The purpose of the formal caution is to give your child time to understand the impact of their behaviour and agree on a support plan. The school will give you and your child the chance to meet to discuss the behaviour and to plan or review the supports your child needs.

The formal caution for a behaviour of concern is in place for up to 50 school days. During this time, your child may be suspended if behaviours of concern continue.





Year 10 Engineering Studies



The NSW Department of Education is coordinating an emergency response effort that is unprecedented in terms of scale and impact. A large number of schools located in the Northern Rivers have sustained damage to either part of the site or all of the site.

Maclean High School also experienced damage as a result of the flood event.

An information session for the Maclean High School community has been planned to provide information on the status of 'make safe' works undertaken to date, planned remediation and repair work, and engagement opportunities.
