School Production - The Election



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New House Names for Maclean High School

Maclean High School has worked with students, parents/carers, staff and community members to rename and revitalise the school's house points system. The school wanted the new house names to reflect its unique environment and community. Consultation sessions that included the SRC, Junior AECG, Positive Behaviour for Learning Committee, and AECG, resulted in a range of possible options being presented for community consideration. A public vote saw the local community come together to select the Yaegl words for local animals of significance as the successful option. Consequently, the new house names for Maclean High School are:

A-D Yugaamgan – (Coastal Emu - Yellow) E-K- Wuy-wuy – (Dolphin - Blue) L-Q- Waandyi – (Dingo - Red) R-Z- Garidi – (Eagle - Green)

Along with the new house names is a reignition of the house points framework. This process attempts to foster positive relationships, connection, a sense of belonging and healthy competition among students. Students will be awarded points for positive behaviour in class, representing the school in academic, sporting, and extra-curricular activities, high achievement, and engaging with school carnivals. Ongoing school-based challenges and competitions will provide students with additional opportunities to gain house points.

The House Points System will run as follows:

- Students and staff are assigned to their house based on the first letter of their last name.
- Each house has four senior representative House Captains who will lead by example, and who will attempt to guide their house to success.
- The house competition will run annually from Term 4 through to the end of Term 3 the following year. This is to follow the Year 12 cycle.

Currently we have students designing logos that will represent each house. Students are encouraged to submit their artwork to Mr Obst in the PDHPE Staffroom.

We look forward to seeing our students pushing themselves academically, behaviourally, and physically as they work to take home to House Cup for 2022/23. Let the games begin!





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NSW Department of Education – School Infrastructure

Maclean High School Works Notification

School Infrastructure NSW and Public Works are managing the repair and remediation of buildings and grounds at Maclean High School that were damaged by flood waters and heavy rain in March 2022. These works are part of a significant infrastructural program being undertaken at Maclean High School.

School Holidays Work

From Monday 26 September for 2 weeks, the contractor will undertake the following work:

- establish a site for work crews. This will be fenced off from student access.
- install scaffolding around the library to allow for the replacement of the library building roof in term four.
- locate underground utilities. Some noise will be associated with these investigations.

An AQF5 qualified arborist has been engaged to assess necessary vegetation removal. This includes one dead tree, five trees with roots that are damaging school infrastructure, and vegetation overhanging buildings and pathways.

Work will take place Monday to Friday, from 7am to 4pm.


Contractors will enter and leave the school Staff carparking area. Traffic management will be in place for deliveries and the movement of large vehicles and cranes. A boom gate will be installed at the lower section of the carpark for access to the contractor's compound.
