Open Boys Cricket

On Thursday 8th of December, Maclean High Open Boys Cricket team played Hastings Secondary College (Port Macquarie) in the North Coast Regional final of the state-wide Alan Davison Shield. Maclean had previously defeated Kyogle High in the Richmond Rivers Zone final and Bellingen High in the North Coast semi-final.

Hastings won the toss and batted first, scoring 5 for 165 in their allotted 40 overs. Best bowling figures for Maclean was Marley Lawrence who bowled 6 overs with 2 maidens, claiming 2 wickets for 15 runs (6-2-15-2), Zane Lowe (6-0-17-1), Zachary Quick (6-0-21-1) and James Lobb (6-1-20-0) also bowled well. Overall, this was a great fielding effort by Maclean, restricting Hastings to a run rate of just over 4 an over on a very fast outfield.

Maclean began their innings scoring quickly, well above the required run rate. Luke Lambert held the chase together scoring 61 runs being ably supported by the big hitting Riley Anderson (23). With 40 runs still required both Luke and Riley were dismissed within an over of each other. However, Daniel Couper (31 not out) and Zachary Quick (10 not out) batted sensibly and were still together when they passed the Hasting total with 11 overs remaining.

Maclean now play Farrar High (Tamworth) in an away game early in first term 2023.

Welcome back to 2023!

We are hoping to have YONDR pouches for year 7 soon. Mobile phones are not be used during school hours. If any student needs to contact home, they are able to report to the front office or the attendance window. Our mobile phone policy has not changed and all students are expected to keep their mobile phone in a YONDR pouch. Students are also able to leave their phone in the front office for collection at the end of the day. Replacement pouches are \$15 and we have a small supply which are available for purchase. Students may also use their flood relief funding for this.

The demolition work on our old basketball courts has been completed and work on the new footings has commenced. The canteen area and classrooms E1-E5 now have a brand-new roof and classrooms are in the process of being repainted and having new carpet installed. I would like to thank our students and staff for adapting to the necessary disruptions that the refurbishments have caused. We are hoping to have these classrooms back in action over the next week and we look forward to students having bright and fresh spaces in which to learn.

We have welcomed some new staff this year at MHS. Mr Mitchell is our new music teacher and year 9 advisor, Mr Durney, Mr Hutchinson, Mr Wilson, Mr Schollbach have joined Special Education and Mr Ramnath will be joining us in Mathematics. YONDR POUCHES



As students enter the phone-free space, phones will be placed in a Yondr case.



LCCK Once inside, the case will lock. Students keep their phones throughout the day.



To unlock the case, tap it on any teacher or administrator's unlocking base.

Mobile Phones and YONDR Pouches

A reminder for our families that mobile phones are to be kept securely in a YONDR pouch during school hours. Failure to do so will result in disciplinary action as per our behaviour and discipline policy.

Normal Operating Procedures

Students are expected to use the unlocking stations each morning as they enter to unlock their pouch, turn their device off and place it inside. The pouch must remain locked throughout the day. At the end of the day, students should proceed to the unlocking stations to unlock their pouches. No unpouched device is permitted on school grounds once a student is on site. Student YONDR pouches should be closed and locked at all times except when adding or removing their devices at the beginning and end of the school day. The Attendance Office will also have its own unlocking station that can be used for late arrival/early departure unlocking by staff. Unlocking stations will only be available until 09:15 each morning. They will be secured until 15:15, when they will again be made available. This includes wireless earphones/headphones. When sighted these devices will be treated in the same manner as other banned electronic devices. Wired earphones/headphones may be used during class times ONLY as per teacher instructions when accessing learning activities with video content.


Recess / Lunch / Breaks

Electronic devices are to remain in locked YONDR pouches on school grounds at all times.

Early Leavers

Students who leave school early will be able to unlock their devices at the Attendance Office when signing out.

If you have lost your YONDR pouch or it is damaged a replacement pouch can be purchased from the Front Office.
