- **Data for Improvement:** Provides valuable insights that help schools, parents, and education authorities pinpoint areas for enhancement in teaching and learning.
- **Accountability:** Acts as a vital tool for ensuring that schools meet educational standards.
- **Tracking Progress:** Facilitates the monitoring of student progress over time, informing curriculum development and policy decisions.
- **Informed Decisions:** Offers data that assists parents in making knowledgeable choices regarding their children's education.

A heartfelt congratulations to all Year 7 and 9 students who participated in NAPLAN. We look forward to seeing the results later this year!

Last week, Year 7 had the opportunity to participate in our annual Cultural Tours. A big thank you to our Humanities/Languages and Aboriginal Education Team for their hard work in organising this event. It was a wonderful couple of days where our Yaegl Elders and students came together to learn about our local country. Special recognition goes to our Year 12 Aboriginal Studies class for mentoring our Year 7 students during these enriching experiences.

Legal Aid Workshop

She explained the significance of understanding award wages and how to identify their entitlements, ensuring that they are aware of their rights to fair pay and safe working conditions.

The introduction of the Speak Up, Save Lives app was a highlight of the session, as it offers a platform for young workers to access vital information and support related to workplace rights. Students learned how this app can empower them to advocate for themselves and seek assistance if they encounter any issues at work.

Overall, the presentation was a fantastic opportunity for our students to engage with important legal concepts that will benefit them in their future employment. We are grateful to Karina for her time and expertise, and we encourage all students to make use of the resources provided to ensure they are informed and confident as they enter the workforce.

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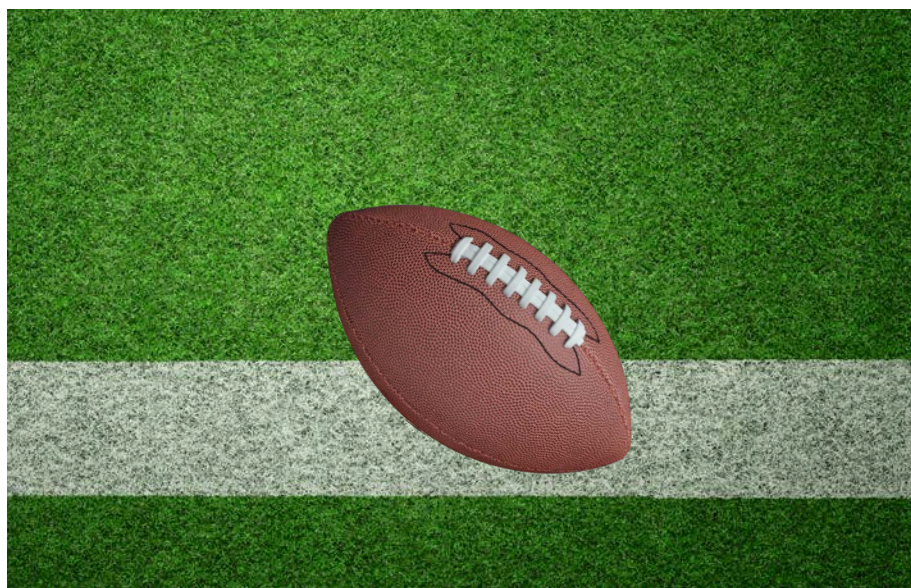
